Production history

These recordings were collected by Tom Baxter during August and September 1987 along the Canning Stock Route in Western Australia. Recordings were made either along the Stock Route at various water locations or in Fitzroy Crossing. The purpose of the recordings was to document stories of pre-contact and first contact between the Aboriginal speakers and non-Indigenous settlers. The recordings were made during the first return to traditional country after migration to cattle country. Stories centre upon water locations, especially the wells, along the Canning Stock Route. The recordings are in a combination of Aboriginal English, Gooniyandi, Walmajarri and Wangkajunga. Speakers include: Blind Billy, Georgie Short, Andy Campbell, Wylie Jindabee, Edith, Emily Forrest (Mirantawu), Wombat Williams, Charlie Nunjan, Jimmy James (Wirrali), Peter Goodigee (Kurtiji), Chum Lee, Alex Rogers, Moira George, David Downs, Freddy Purti and unidentified male and female speakers. This collection was deposited with AIATSIS in 2004 by Tom Baxter.
