## ARCHIVIST'S NOTE

This finding aid was compiled from information provided by the Wangka Maya Pilbara Aboriginal Language Centre. Detailed item descriptions, featuring timing points, are not yet available as the collection has not been auditioned by AIATSIS staff. The listing supplied by Wangka Maya states that there are thirteen tapes in this collection, but only four were received. The numbers on the tapes do not correspond to the numbers on the listing: tape 1 corresponds to description 2 on the listing; tape 2 corresponds to description 9; tape 3 corresponds to description 12; and tape 4 corresponds to description 13. The contents of field tape four are listed as “James Solomon – Ngarluma ‘Thalu sites” on both the cassette cover and the listing, but the tape is in fact a copy of a historical recording, probably by Carl von Brandenstein.
