Cummeragunga—"my home"—has sheltered many hundreds of Aboriginal people since its establishment in 1889.

Children have grown-up and left the property, families have come and gone, but most people, no matter where they have settled eventually, still retain strong ties with their birthplace.

For about 300 people the weekend of 20th May meant a revival of feeling for their former home. They travelled from as far as Brewarrina to attend "Back to Cummeragunga" celebrations and to talk over old times with friends and relatives from places
