Collection Overview

Scope and Contents note

The collection contains papers relating to the Mowanjum Community. Barunga, a Worrorra Elder, was an active member of this Community. There is a wealth of data about Mowanjum residents in Freeman's foolscap notebook containing data on 'The Mowanjum Community: an enquiry'. Also included are notes by Freeman on the Mowanjum Community, papers relating to housing at the Community, including a Housing Project, minutes of meetings held at the Community, quarterly plans for the Community and lists of members of the Community and of the Mowanjum Mission School and Pre-School. The collection also includes photographs, newspaper clippings, notes and transcripts that provide to additional context to the collection and insight about Barunga's life, ideas and his friendship with Freeman.

Provenance

The collection was deposited with AIATSIS in two consignments in 1986 and 2024. The papers in series 1-4 were deposited with the AIATSIS Library, in memory of Albert Barunga, by Professor John Derek Freeman, in May 1986. Photographs and slides received with the collection are held in the AIATSIS photographic collection.

Series 5 was offered to AIATSIS by Freeman's daughter Hilary Freeman in January 2022 items were reviewed by AIATSIS staff and official donation occurred on 24 April 2024. The papers in Series 5 came into her possession as part of the deceased estate following her mother's death in 2012. The folder was compiled prior to Barunga's death (1977) The notes were probably penned by Freeman (John Derek). Some of the photographs taken in Canberra on Barunga's two visits in May 1972 and June 1973 were taken by Sylvia Neumann and Gordon Reid, for others the photographer is unknown. Photographs taken outside of Barunga's visits to Canberra in May 1972 and June 1973 may have been given to Freeman by Barunga or his family. It is unclear how Freeman acquired the ABC interview and the WA Museum transcripts.

Some photographs in the collection do not have dates but share features with others that indicate that they may have been taken by the same photographer, in the same location or on the same date. These photographs are marked with date and location preceded by the word 'likely'. The rationale behind each of these decisions is outlined in the archivists note.

Biographical and Administrative history note

Albert Barunga was born in 1913 and died in 1977. He was a noted elder, and main spokesperson, for the Worrorra tribe.

A founding member of the Aboriginal Cultural Foundation, Barunga was involved in encouraging Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to contribute to the recording of their legends and life stories, which subsequently resulted in the publication of several books and the production of a number of tape-recorded reminiscences.

About this little devil and this little fella, story told by Albert Barunga; transcription by Stephen Muecke, and illustrations by Julie Dowling (Broome, W.A.,1999) was on the Western Australian Premier's Book Awards 1999 shortlist.

Barunga was the young 'tracker' who found Charles Kingsford Smith when his plane, the *Southern Cross*, was lost near the Kunmunya mission in the Kimberley on its way to Wyndham in 1929.

The Mowanjum Mission was established when the Presbyterian Board of Missions purchased a small property in 1955. The Mowanjum Community Inc. was incorporated on October 5, 1972, joining the Worrorra, Ngarinyin and Wunambal Peoples who lived at Mowanjum, six miles from Derby. In 1973 Freeman was authorised by the Ruling Body of the Community to act as their agent in Canberra and elsewhere, in accordance with instructions from the Ruling Body.

This Biographical note is adapted from the original finding aid updated by J. Churches in November 2002.

Archivists note

In 2024 an additional consignment of material collected and arranged by Freeman was donated by his daughter Hilary. This material was kept in a small black ring bound folder with 39 pages bound on the rings and additional material slid in the back of the folder. Majority of this loose material was held in a small plastic envelope excepting one photograph (MS 2253/5/2/7) which was slid behind the envelope at the back of the folder. Given that this material has shared provenance and related subject matter donation was added to MS 2533 as Series 5. The donation was further divided into two subseries, subseries 1 includes material bound in the folder and subseries 2 includes the loose material. Subseries 1 is organised into items based on similar date and subject matter. However, items have been kept in original order. For example. There are handwritten notes discussing Barunga's values in items 8 and 10, despite similar subject matter they were not combined because in the original folder there was other material between them. Similarly, the item numbers in subseries 2 reflect the original order the items were organised inside the plastic envelope. Subseries 1 was removed from the original folder due to risk of rust damage. The items in this series were rehoused in manilla folders inside a four-flap folder. Subseries 2 was rehoused in archive safe plastic and polypropylene sleeves. These are organised in manilla folders with the lower number item facing the left side of the folder and placed inside a four-flap folder. The folder and envelope were retained and are held in box 4 with Series 5.

Items MS 2533/5/2/3-4 are identified as likely taken by Gordon Reid on the 27 May 1972. This is because they appear to be copies of the photograph in item MS 2533/5/1/14 marked with this date and photographer. Item MS 2533/5/2/5 is identified as likely taken on 30 May 1972. This is because, in this photograph, Barunga can be seen in the same clothes, outside the same building as in the photograph in item MS 2533/5/1/11. It is also noted that a photograph in item MS 2533/5/1/12 is taken on this date by Mrs Sylvia Neumann. Given that her husband is one of the subjects of the photograph in MS 2533/5/1/11, it is possible that she is also the photographer of MS 2533/5/1/12 and therefore MS 2533/5/2/5.
