BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Peter K Austin grew up near Nemingha in northern NSW, Australia. He began his linguistics career at the Australian National University in Canberra, with a BA (Asian Studies) majoring in Japanese and Linguistics in 1974, followed by a PhD in 1978, on the Diyari (Dieri) language of South Australia.

Peter then taught at the University of Western Australia, held a Harkness Fellowship at UCLA and Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1979-80, and in 1981 set up the Department of Linguistics at La Trobe University Melbourne. He held visiting appointments at Max Planck Institute for Psycholinguistics at Nijmegen, Tokyo University of Foreign Studies, University of Hong Kong and Stanford University, and was Foundation Professor of Linguistics at the University of Melbourne from 1996-2002.

He became the Märit Rausing Chair in Field Linguistics in January 2003 and then Emeritus professor in Field Linguistics at SOAS (School of African and Oriental Studies, London), before retiring in January 2019. Throughout his career, he has been deeply involved in work to salvage languages that are on the verge of extinction.

As of June 2019, he has been working with colleagues at the University of Warsaw and Leiden University on an EU Horizon 2020 Twinning collaboration called the Engaged Humanities project. He has also been working with the University of Malaya on a research project in Malaysia.

He is widely published in the fields of language documentation, syntax, linguistic typology and in particular, endangered languages and language revitalisation. After a long academic career in Australia, Hong Kong, the United States of America, Japan, Germany and the United Kingdom, Peter Austin is emeritus professor at SOAS University of London.

He co-authored, with David Nathan, the first fully page-formatted hypertext dictionary on the World Wide Web, a bilingual dictionary of Gamilaraay (Kamilaroi), northern New South Wales, as well as publishing seven bilingual dictionaries of Aboriginal languages. He also worked with the Dieri Aboriginal Corporation on revitalisation of the Dieri language spoken in South Australia. He is widely published, including books, journals and book chapters.

Peter Austin has won the following awards:

- 1974 ANU medal in Linguistics
- 1978 Harkness Fellowship of the Commonwealth Fund of New York
- 1999 Deutsche Akamedische Austauschdienst (German Academic Exchange Fellowship)
- 2002 Alexander von Humboldt Foundation Humboldt Research Award (Forschungspreis)
- 2015 Honorary doctorate from the Faculty of Languages at Uppsala University

Peter Austin was also a member of the Australian Institute of Aboriginal Studies and deposited audio (language elicitation, songs and narratives, oral histories), and manuscript (dictionaries, field notes, language classification, grammar) material here.

COLLECTION OVERVIEW

Scope and contents note

This collection consists of photocopies of field notes by Peter Kenneth Austin dating from 1978 to 1985. They include language elicitation: vocabulary, word lists, sentences, kinship terms, place names and song words. The language material was collected from the following areas in Western Australia: Pilbara area (WA SF50, SF51, SG50), Gascoyne / Murchison area (WA SG50), Carnarvon (WA South Pilbara / Gascoyne SG49-04)
