COLLECTION OVERVIEW

Scope and content note

The collection contains notes, drafts and background material for McCarthy's unpublished book entitled 'Artists of the sandstone'. A typescript copy of this manuscript is held in the Library at MS 3495. There are also notes on the Sydney and Hawkesbury areas. Other papers, reports, correspondence, radio and television broadcast scripts and newspaper clippings covering a variety of subjects including rock art, stone implements, material culture and other aspects of the lives of Indigenous Australians.

Other material includes manuscripts on rock art at Mt Cameron West in Tasmania and the Cobar Pediplain in New South Wales, the Arnhem Land Expedition in 1948, Port Hedland and Aurukun. The Aurukun material mainly concerns dances. There are also field notebooks from a number of trips.

Provenance

This collection was deposited in the Australian Institute of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Studies (AIATSIS) Library in May 1991 by Frederick McCarthy. He deposited further manuscript material and photographs in 1987.

Material separated from collection

Photographs received with this collection have been passed to the <u>Audiovisual Archive</u>. Copies have been returned to the Library for incorporation in the manuscript collection. Photograph albums received with the collection are being conserved and will then be copied by Audiovisual Archives and incorporated into this collection.

In 1987 McCarthy donated a tape of an interview with him and a file of papers relating to his 1964 appointment as the Foundation Principal of the Australian Institute of Aboriginal Studies, now the Australian Institute of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Studies. The papers, originally held in this collection, were moved to $\underline{\text{MS 4352}}$ in 2005.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Frederick David McCarthy was born in 1906 and began work in 1920 at the Australian Museum, Sydney. In 1933 he enrolled at Sydney University in Anthropology under Professor A.P. Elkin. His thesis, held in Series 17 of this collection, was accepted in 1935. McCarthy and his wife, Elsie Bramell, were the first professionally trained anthropologists/archaeologists in an Australian museum.

In 1937-38 McCarthy attended the third Congress of Prehistorians of the Far East, held in Singapore, and visited Indonesia. In 1938 the first of eight editions of his *Australian Aboriginal decorative art* was published, and in 1946 he co-authored, with Bramell and Herbert V. Noone, *The stone implements of Australia*.

In 1948 McCarthy joined the American-Australian Scientific Expedition to Arnhem Land, led by C.P. Mountford. In 1957 his *Australia's Aborigines: their life and culture*, the first general account of the complexity of Aboriginal societies was published.

In 1958 McCarthy studied the Aboriginal art of north-western Australia and the rock art of central western NSW and published the first of four editions of *Australian Aboriginal rock art*. During his 1961 visit to Aurukun McCarthy described forty three dance dramas and collected and documented sculpture which is now part of the collection of the National Museum of Australia.

In 1964 McCarthy was appointed Foundation Principal of the Australian Institute of Aboriginal Studies, a position he held until he retired in 1971. In his retirement he worked on his major manuscript 'Artists of the sandstone' which describes the contact ethnography of the Sydney region. Notes and drafts of this work form a large part of this collection. The final manuscript is held by the Library at MS 3495.

McCarthy's contribution to scholarship was acknowledged in 1980 by the award of an honorary Doctor of Science degree by the Australian National University. He published more than three hundred papers, articles and monographs. There is a bibliography of his published works to 1988, compiled by Kate Khan in 1993, and entitled 'Frederick David McCarthy: a bibliography' in Records of the Australian Museum, Supplement 17: 7-15. , 1993, is held by the Library at S 50/1.
