Biographical history note

Linguist, artist and educator Dr Jennifer (Jenny) Anne Green was born in 1954. Since the 1970s, Dr Green has documented signed and spoken languages, oral histories, songs, and visual arts of Indigenous people in Northern and Central Australia. In 1977 Dr Green facilitated the government sponsored program to teach the art of batik to the women of the homeland community of Utopia in the Northern Territory.

Traditionally a women's art form originating in Indonesia, batik is a method of decorating cloth by applying designs in hot wax to the fabric followed by dyes. The process may be repeated several times before removing the wax in boiling water.

The subjects of the batik works in this collection reflect the daily interactions of the artists with their environment, including leaves, flowers, seeds and grasses and incorporate designs that can be translated easily with melted wax.

These early batik workshops marked the emergence of Aboriginal women artists in their own right across the Central Desert. Prior to the workshops, Indigenous women had only been known to assist Indigenous men in the completion of their paintings and were rarely permitted to paint their own canvases.

Museum Victoria was the first cultural institution in Australia to collect Utopia batiks and in 1980, the first exhibition of the Utopia batiks was held in Mparntwe (Alice Springs). The following year, the Utopia Women's Batik Group was formed, with original members including Audrey and Emily Kngwarreye, Lena Pwerle, and the Petyarre sisters Kathleen, Violet, Gloria, Nancy, Myrtle and Ada.
