Collection Overview

Scope and Contents note

In 1973 the Australian Institute of Aboriginal Studies obtained Federal funding to conduct a national survey of Aboriginal cultural heritage. The NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service successfully applied to access this Federal funding to initially employ two staff comprising Creamer and Dunghutti man Ray Kelly for the newly created Sites of Significance Survey team. Over the next 14 years the team grew and travelled around NSW recording sacred sites. This evolved to not only record sacred sites but rather many sites of cultural significance. This collection comprises the field notes made by Creamer on anthropological field trips during this time around NSW. Creamer used the notebooks to keep track of the many meetings he had with elders and other community members, where he went and what he saw. The notebooks also include occasional references to cultural sites Creamer photographed and audio interviews he recorded during the creation of the survey. The Survey contributed to a cultural revival amongst Aboriginal people in New South Wales and shaped substantial policy and structural changes to the management of Aboriginal cultural heritage by the NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service. These notebooks record significant Aboriginal cultural sites and stories across New South Wales and therefore hold references to sacred sites, ceremonies, massacre sites and occasional genealogical information.

Provenance

This material was donated to the Australian Institute of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Studies by Howard Creamer in 2024. This collection adds greatly to the material deposited by the National Parks and Wildlife Service, and the over thirty related photographic and audio collections deposited by Creamer represent the entire creamer archive from 1973 – 1987.

After graduating from Cambridge University and then assisting in anthropological field work in Malaysia, Howard (Harry) Creamer arrived in Darwin on the 9th of November 1972. In March 1973 at twenty-two years old Creamer was hired by the National Parks and Wildlife Service as a social anthropologist to locate and record sites of significance across NSW. Creamer went on to work for the NPWS until 2012.

MS 5375/ 1/3 Notebook no. 3 December 1974 – January 1976

Continued notes on various meeting with people, recommendations of sites to visit and descriptions of sites around NSW. Features drawn maps and locations of sites. Includes for example, stories linking areas of the Simpson desert, notes from an Aboriginal Studies seminar, word translation lists, information on male initiations, burial grounds, and massacre sites.

MS 5375/ 1/4 Notebook no. 4 January 1976 – July 1977

Continued notes on sites and meetings with community members around NSW. Features description of environment, plants and their medicinal uses, women's contraceptive practices and other cultural knowledge. Notes include for example, surveys of cemeteries, scarred trees, stories of the forming of mountain ranges, word translations and information relating to male initiations.

MS 5375/ 1/5 Notebook no. 5 October 1977 – January 1981

Continued notes on sites and meetings with community members around NSW. Features locations and descriptions of middens in the north coast of NSW. Includes for example, notes on various bora ground locations, burials, a birthing location, and information from Harry Buchanan, Milli Boyd, Charles Herbert and others.

MS 5375/1/6 Notebook no. 6 January 1981 – August 1982

Continued notes on sites and meetings with community members around NSW. Features community member's life histories, information of middens and carved trees and histories relevant to various sites. Includes for example notes on Aboriginal culture and initiations experienced during the depression, sexual practices, discussion of racism, and Creamer's analysis of contemporary engagement with cultural practices. References to audio tapes.

MS 5375/ 1/7 Notebook no. 7 August 1982 – August 1985

Continued notes on sites and meetings with community members around NSW. Features notes for example on a Cabbage Tree town meeting and discission with people on current political issues and planned development effecting locals. Notes include information relating to spirits, histories of Clevermen, cultural practice involving menstrual blood, sacred sites, and significance of areas such as Norah Head and others around the central coast and inland NSW. Further investigation and reflections of the idea of culture 'loss'.

MS 5375/ 1/8 Notebook no. 8 November 1985 – June 1986.

Final notebook features meetings with long held contacts of Creamer and notes of general community culture in places such as Bellbrook, Nambucca, Deniliquin and others. Includes information such as family lineage and descriptions of significant cultural sites around NSW.

MS 5375/ 1/9 Additional loose pages 1974 – 1984

Additional pages with notes, names, and information relating to site visits and work in: February 1974; April 1975; July 1978; May 1982.
