Dr Eric Michaels, a graduate of the University of Texas, was an Australian Institute of Aboriginal Studies Research Fellow, 1982 - 1986, who was appointed to The Remote Television Project, an enquiry into the introduction of electronic and mass media to remote Aboriginal communities. His field study was carried out with Warlpiri speakers at Yuendumu, NT. Results of the Project included establishment of Australia's first community television station through the Warlpiri Media Association which was licensed to transmit daily programs in Warlpiri language. Dr Michael's report, <u>The Aboriginal Invention of Television in Central Australia</u>, was published by Aboriginal Studies Press in 1986. In 1987 Dr Michaels accepted a lectureship in Media Studies, Department of Humanities, Griffith University, Queensland. He died in Brisbane on 24 August 1988.
