Collection Overview

Scope and contents note

This collection contains personal papers of Malcolm Lyon in relation to the work he undertook for the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs relating to the Torres Strait Treaty.

The Treaty, signed in December 1978, defines the maritime boundaries and management agreements for the Torres Strait, situated between Australia and Papua New Guinea. The Treaty also outlines the administrative arrangements for people to move between the two countries, protects plant and animal life, and the ways of life of the traditional inhabitants of the Torres Strait Protected Zone.

The collection includes general correspondence, a signed copy of the Torres Strait Treaty, an invitation to the ceremony for the signing of the Torres Strait Treaty, Joint Committee reports (including maps), media releases and press kits, newspaper clippings, and copies of DFAT publications and extracts from Hansard.

The collection contains material for the period 1975 – 2002.

This collection was donated to AIATSIS by Diana Lyon, wife of the late Malcolm Lyon, in 2017.

Biographical note

Malcolm Lyon OBE, was an Australian Public Servant and Diplomat. Commencing as a Cadet in 1954, he spent more than 30 years working for the Department of External Affairs (note: in 1970, the Department of External Affairs was abolished and replaced by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade).

In the 1970s, Lyon headed the Papua New Guinea Branch in Canberra (1975 to 1977) and worked as Deputy Head of Mission in the Papua New Guinea High Commission. In 1978, Lyon led border negotiations between Australia and Papua New Guinea, that contributed to the signing of the 1978 Torres Strait Treaty. This was a major diplomatic achievement of the time, and Lyon was subsequently made an Officer of the Order of the British Empire (OBE) in 1979 for public service.
