Production history

In 1988 Prime Minister Bob Hawke was invited to attend the Barunga Sport and Cultural Festival, an annual event hosted by the Barunga community located 90 km west of Katherine. In their final AIAS film production, director Kim McKenzie and sound recordist Wayne Barker travel to Barunga to record preparations for the festival, including the writing, painting and presentation of the Barunga Statement – a collaborative painted petition presented to the Prime Minister by the Chairs of the Central Land Council and Northern Land Council, Wenten Rubuntja and Galarrwuy Yunupingu on behalf of the many clans from the Northern Territory.
