	2. I would like to welcome you all to Kalkadoon Park for Day 6 of Cultural Revival Week. There will be entertainment for the kids, refreshments such as hamburgers and soft drinks. If you haven't tasted Aboriginal food cooked out in the open; roo tail cooked on coals and goanna; you'd like it, it's great food, so come and have a taste. There will also be a local band from the area, if you want

	<p>to dance and rage. There will be an Aboriginal art display. You'll also see boxing and athletics as entertainment for the kids, and an Iron man contest. You can also meet Secretary of the Department of Aboriginal Affairs, Charles Perkins, who will also be at the BBQ on the East Leichhardt River near the bridge. This is your chance to see Aboriginal Culture brought out in the dances. There is a bus provided free if you want to go on a tour to Painted Rocks and Sun Rock with some of the Elders and concerned people. You will hear Aboriginal sounds from didgeridoo to rock. Come out and meet your fellow countrymen, the original Australians. It will be a unique opportunity to get together and talk, and see; you'll find there is more to Aboriginal life than normally meets the eye. So open up and join us during Kalkadoon Week.</p>

The Kalkadoon Tribal Council is holding a cultural revival week. On Thursday 18th a tour has been arranged for Elders and concerned people to visit Painted Rocks and Sun Rock. Following the tour, there will be a BBQ at the East Leichhardt River. Also, a corroboree performed by 4 local dancers. An enjoyable day for all.
