# **Production history**

A production by the Lieder Theatre Company about a Wiradjuri man and AIF soldier from the Goulburn district, NSW: William Joseph Punch. The production is based on the research of Albert Speer and follows Punch's early life as a member of the Goulburn community, his deployment with the 53rd Australian Infantry Battalion to France in 1916 and concludes with his death in an English hospital in 1917.

The production was recorded by AIATSIS. Footage includes setup, Acts 1-3 (Act 2 is an interactive intermission) and the edited master.

Themes include: Wiradjuri people, frontier violence, dispossession, assimilation, racism and identity, the First World War, the Conscription Referendum and the Anzac Legend.
