Production history

These recordings were made during 1970 as part of an AIAS grant awarded to Janet Mathews to study languages in the Bourke region of northern New South Wales. Janet Mathews supplied Jimmy Barker with a tape recorder and tapes to record himself at Brewarrina. The recordings document vocabulary, grammar, discussion and stories by Jimmy Barker in Muruwari and English. This collection was deposited with the Australian Institute of Aboriginal Studies on 1 June 1970.
