Thankyou for the very welcome information in your kind answer to my query. Pespite your warning about the poor quality of these old wax-cylinders (How well I know these shocking sounds!) I am now writing to ask you if I may arrange for copies to be made of all those you mentioned.

In the Archives of the Sydney University, there are about six brown wax-cylinders recorded in Western Australia by A.R. Radcliffe -Brown, presumably in 1912. It will be very interesting to compare these with your four Western Australian examples of "ein wenig dubioser Herkunft". Incidentally, I should be grateful if you could send me, along with the copies, a brief description of the cylinders... colour, size, playing time, general condition etc. hope I am not asking for too much!

The copies, I assume, will be made on magnetic tape (Tonband). Please inform me of the arrangements made in your Museum for sending tape copies of this kind.
