




Dispossesion

Indigenous leaders, including members of the original group which negotiated with government about Native title, meeting with ILC directors in Canberra to support the campaign to protect and strengthen the Land Account.

Land acquisition and management not a substitute for the promised social justice package



A Stronger Land Account Amendment Bill

- Includes a stronger purpose for the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Land Account, specifying that the Land Account is a compensatory mechanism.
- Prevents the Land Account from being utilised for any purpose other than the land-related benefit of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.
- Strengthens Indigenous Control over the Land Account
 - NEW Indigenous Nomination Committee to inform appointments to the Board
- Introduces strong new measures requiring the ILC to comply with the highest standards of corporate governance, transparency and accountability.
 - Limiting tenure of Board members
 - Introduces a new Code of Conduct for ILC Board members and staff.
