Non-exclusive Native Title is weak:

Must get permission from pastoralist to enter.

Cannot do much when you do enter.


Cannot make money out of the land.


Exclusive Native Title is strong:


'Good against the whole world'

The People are free to do what they like on the land.

There is money in beef.







A lease used really be a lease (for a TERM).

The Newman Government changed this.

Now, the pastoralist can automatically 'roll-over' the lease; the People can never get their land back.

We think this is unconstitutional. If so, the Newman laws go.

Our hope is that things may go as follows (an EXAMPLE):

- **1. Many centuries ago**: A People roams their land.
- 2. 200-odd years ago: The white man comes.
- **3. 1980**: A pastoral lease is issued over land of the People to a white family.
- 4. 2010: Native title (non-exclusive) is recognised in the People.
- **5. 2016**: The lease expires; the People bid for the new lease, and get it. 'Cultural heritage' is important in the Minister's decision. THE NATIVE TITLE NOW GOES EXCLUSIVE.
- **6. 2017 into the future**. The People are pastoralists on their own land. Young Traditional owners are trained as cattlemen and cattlewomen. The business is very profitable; demand for beef from China and India is large and growing.
