The bill seeks to protect the Land Account from being used for purposes other than land-related benefits for Aboriginal people and Torres Strait Islanders. 21 June 2014	WA	Demolishment of remote Oombulgurri community buildings	The State Government has decided to move forward with plans to demolish around 60 buildings within the Oombulgurri community. Residents were moved to a neighbouring area following the closure of the town site in 2011. The Balanggarra Aboriginal Corporation is calling on the Government to delay demolition proceedings whilst further discussions are held amongst Oombulgurri community members regarding reopening the town. 20 June 2014	WA	Proposed changes to the Western Australia's Aboriginal Heritage Act	The State Government has proposed changes to the WA Aboriginal Heritage Act, which could diminish the control traditional owners have over sacred sites. The proposed changes will also impose fines of up to \$50,000 on traditional owners who do not notify the Government of sacred sites. The State Government maintain these changes are will improve consistency regarding Aboriginal heritage protection. An eight week consultation period has commenced regarding these changes. Issues have arisen between state and native fishers regarding a conservation plan established by the Passamaquoddy people regarding sustainability of the eel industry. 12 June 2014	NSW	Darkinjung peoples win case regarding use of traditional land	The New South Wales Land and Environment Court have handed down a decision in favour of the Darkinjung peoples regarding the proposed Wallarah 2 coal mine which would involve rail lines being constructed on traditional lands. The Court found that the approval of the Kores proposal to be use traditional land for a minimum of 28years would amount to "compulsory acquisition" of traditional land granted under the <i>Aboriginal Land Rights Act</i> 1983 (NSW).
