1. Introduction

Queensland has a significant area of determined native title lands. Native title had been recognised over 437,547km² or approximately 97% of the State. At December 2015, 70 registered prescribed bodies corporate had been set up to hold on trust or manage that land on behalf of the native title holders. At that time, there had been 123 native title determinations within Queensland, comprising 117 claimant determinations and six non-claimant determinations. This includes 30 claimant determinations in the Torres Strait region.

Native title lands in Queensland also overlap with existing Aboriginal tenures. The [Aboriginal Land Act 1991 \(Qld\)](#) (ALA) and the [Torres Strait Islander Land Act 1991 \(QLD\)](#) (TSILA) enables the transfer of all existing deed of grant in trust (DOGIT), reserve lands, and the Arukun and Mornington Island shire leases to trustees for the benefit of either Aboriginal people or Torres Strait Islanders. The [Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Land \(Providing Freehold\) and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2014](#) includes provisions that amended the ALA and the TSILA to enable ordinary freehold title in the township areas of the state's 34 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities on DOGIT lands. The [Cape York Peninsula Tenure Resolution Program](#) also aims to return ownership and management of particular lands on Cape York Peninsula to local Aboriginal people (see the Land Rights section below).

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Land Services and Native Title Services within the [Department of Natural Resources and Mines](#) (DNRM) provide advice and assistance on native title and Indigenous land issues including those relating to land use, mining, exploration and petroleum tenements. Native title services in mainland Queensland are provided by three native title representative bodies: [Cape York Land Council](#), [Carpentaria Land Council Aboriginal Corporation](#), [North Queensland Land Council](#); and one native title service provider: [Queensland South Native Title Services](#). The [Torres Strait Regional Authority](#) provides native title services in the Torres Strait.

2. Native Title

Native title is the recognition in Australian law, under the [Native Title Act 1993 \(Cth\)](#) (NTA), that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples had a system of law and ownership of their lands before European settlement. The historic High Court decision in [Mabo and Others v State of Queensland \(No 2\) \[1992\] HCA 23; \(1992\) 175 CLR 1](#) (*Mabo*) was the first recognition that native title continues to exist through the common law in Australia. The native title of a particular group is defined by the traditional laws and customs observed by that group of people.

[Section 223](#) of the NTA defines the native title rights and interests that are the subject of a determination of native title under [s 225](#) of the Act. In s 223(1), the term 'native title or native title rights and interests' means the communal, group or individual rights and interests of Aboriginal peoples or Torres Strait Islanders in relation to land or waters, where:

- the rights and interests are possessed under the traditional laws acknowledged, and the traditional customs observed, by the Aboriginal peoples or Torres Strait Islanders; and
- the Aboriginal peoples or Torres Strait Islanders, by those laws and customs, have a connection with the land or waters; and
- the rights and interests are recognised by the common law of Australia.

The significance of the *Mabo* decision lies in the recognition that native title is a pre-existing right, inherent to Indigenous peoples by virtue of their distinct identity as first owners and occupiers of the land and their continuing systems of law. Native title is not a grant or right that is created by the Australian government nor is it dependent upon the government for its existence, although it is dependent on recognition by the common law in order to be enforceable in the Australian legal system. This distinguishes native title from other legislative land rights systems that operate in Australia whereby the government grants the title. Native title may be recognised in places where Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people continue to follow their traditional laws and customs and have maintained a link with their traditional country. Native title in each instance is recognised as having its source in, and deriving its content from, the laws of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. The rights and interests that are recognised as native title may vary from group to group, from one area to another, and may differ depending on what is claimed and what might be negotiated between all of the parties with an interest in the area under claim. Native title rights may include the exclusive possession, use and occupation of traditional country or non-exclusive native title rights such as the right to access and camp or the right to hunt and fish on traditional country. Native title rights do not extend over minerals or petroleum.

The *Mabo* decision recognised Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples' rights over their land, and also recognised the system of laws from which those rights are derived. As a result of the *Mabo* decision and the subsequent enactment of the NTA Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people can apply to the Federal Court of Australia to have their native title rights recognised under Australian law. Native title may be recognised in relation to vacant Crown land, state forests, national parks, public reserves, pastoral leases, beaches, foreshores and waters, government or other public land and Indigenous held land (under land rights legislation).

3. Legislation

The [Native Title Act 1993 \(Cth\)](#) (NTA) is the Australian Government's legislative response to the High Court decision in [Mabo v Queensland \(No 2\) \[1992\] HCA 23; \(1992\) 175 CLR 1](#) which recognised Indigenous Australians' rights and interests in land and waters according to their own traditional laws and customs under [s 223](#). The NTA provides the legal principles for the recognition of native title, the processes involved in having native title recognised and the role and responsibilities of the different bodies involved in this process.

Since it was introduced the NTA has been the subject of numerous reviews and legislative amendments. The annual native title reports of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Social Justice Commissioner provide detailed information about these reviews, reform processes and related legislative amendments, see: [Native Title Reports](#) (1994-2012) and [Social Justice Reports](#) (2013-) on the [Australian Human Rights Commission](#) website for more information. A review of the NTA was undertaken in 2015 by the Australian Law Reform Commission, see below for an overview or read the full report [here](#). A brief overview is also provided below.

Queensland native title legislation

The Queensland Government implemented the [Native Title \(Queensland\) Act 1993 \(Qld\)](#) to validate past acts and later implemented the [Native Title \(Queensland\) State Provisions Act 1998 \(Qld\)](#) in order to validate intermediate period acts. Part 4 of the [Native Title \(Queensland\) State Provisions Act 1998 \(Qld\)](#) confirms the extinguishment of native title by [previous exclusive possession acts](#) attributable to the State, and the partial extinguishment of native title by [previous non-exclusive possession acts](#) attributable to the State. This confirmation extends to Grazing Homestead Perpetual Leases (GHPLs) despite controversy over whether or not such leases extinguish native title.

Under the NTA states and territories may also legislate to establish their own right to negotiate regimes, known as 'alternative procedures' or an [alternative to 'right to negotiate'](#). Such regimes must mirror the NTA regime and gain Commonwealth ministerial approval. From September 2000 to April 2003 Queensland had in place an alternate regime under the [Mineral Resources Act 1989 \(Qld\)](#) (MRA) relating to native title and the grant of mining tenements. In 2003 the Queensland Government amended the MRA through the [Natural Resources and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2003 \(Qld\)](#) with the effect that the [right to negotiate](#) procedure established under the NTA applies to applications made under the MRA on and from the 1 April 2003. Under these arrangements, proponents may apply for exploration permits under the [expedited procedure](#) in the NTA. In order to access the expedited procedure, the Queensland Government requires the proponent to accept [Native Title Protection Conditions](#) (NTPCs) as a condition of exploration permits for

minerals and coal, and some mineral development licences. See the [native title](#) section of the Queensland Government's [Business and Industry portal](#) for more information about these processes, as well as sections 8 & 9 below.

Related legislation

Land and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2014 (Qld)

In May 2014 the Queensland Parliament passed the [Land and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2014 \(Qld\)](#). This legislation allows for agricultural and pastoral leases to be changed to rolling leases with no limits on the number of times the lease may be extended. The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Social Justice Commissioner expressed concerns about whether these lease extensions constitute [future acts](#) therefore requiring native title holders to be both notified and compensated. Policy

The [White Paper on Developing Northern Australia](#) was released by the federal Government in June 2015, and sets out a policy framework for developing business in the top end of Australia over the next 20 years. The report was developed based on community views expressed through the Joint Select Committee on Northern Australia's report 'Pivot North — Inquiry into the Development of Northern Australia' and submissions to the Government's Green Paper on Developing Northern Australia. The federal Government, together with the Western Australian, Northern Territory and Queensland governments, seeks to address the impediments to development in Northern Australia through a broad approach, including:

- Supporting the native title system (\$110 million a year over the next four years) with the aspiration of finalising all existing native title claims within a decade.
- More efficient native title processes that create more certainty for investors and opportunities for native title claimants and holders (through the COAG Indigenous land review).
- \$20.4 million to better support native title holders engage with potential investors.
- Consult on options to use exclusive native title rights for commercial purposes (through the COAG Indigenous land review).
- Consulting on new models to manage native title funds for development.

- Exploring mechanisms to support long term leasehold arrangements for exclusive native title holders.

Department of Justice & the Attorney-General

Department of State Development

The Indigenous Services Unit within the Queensland [Department of State Development](#) (DSD) is responsible for providing advice and assistance to the various business units of the DSD, including the Office of the Coordinator-General, on native title and Indigenous cultural heritage protection issues. This includes facilitating and negotiating Indigenous land use agreements and cultural heritage management

plans relating to planning, development and infrastructure projects. See [Protecting Queensland's cultural heritage](#) on the DSD website for more information.

State Development, Infrastructure and Industry Committee

In June 2012, the State Development, Infrastructure and Industry Committee (SDIIC) was tasked with an inquiry into the future and continued relevance of government land tenure across the State. The Committee released the final report in May 2013. It included a review of the existing land tenure arrangements in all Australian jurisdictions and reported on tenure reform to increase and support the pastoral and tourism industries, ecological values and resource development. In considering the 'needs and aspirations of Indigenous Queenslanders', the Committee made a number of recommendations, including:

- The development of future development area (or regional) Indigenous Land Use Agreements (ILUAs) to achieve a more efficient and cost effective means of complying with native title future act requirements. The area agreements would remove the need to negotiate ILUAs tenure-by-tenure. Compensation would remain to be negotiated between the individual grantee or lessee and the native title party.
- Future development area ILUAs would cover the amendment to current pastoral leases to allow other activities, the amendments of which would otherwise trigger the future act regime under the NTA and necessitate negotiations between the pastoral lessee and native title holders or claimants.
- The establishment of a State Government mediation service to enable the quick resolution of compensation claims between the parties.

The Queensland Government responded to the SDIIC's report in August 2013. It considered that leaseholders need improved security and certainty to promote business investment and diversification in Queensland without impinging on the native title rights of Traditional Owners. The proposals relating to that section of the report were rejected, but the Government committed to developing template ILUAs in consultation with stakeholders to facilitate stream-lined agreement making.

7. Native title determinations

Overview

As at 31 December 2015, there had been a total of 123 native title determinations within Queensland, comprising 117 claimant determinations and six non-claimant determinations. This includes 30 claimant determinations in the Torres Strait region. Information about claimant determinations is provided in Table 7 below. For information about non-claimant determinations use the search tools on the [NNTT](#) and [Agreements, Treaties and Negotiated Settlements \(ATNS\)](#) websites.

Claimant Determinations

As at 31 December 2015, native title had been found to exist in all or parts of the determination areas in 110 of the 117 claimant determinations in Queensland. 8. Registered native title bodies corporate

Overview

Under ss 55-57 of the [Native Title Act 1993 \(Cth\)](#), native title groups are required to nominate a Prescribed Body Corporate (PBC) to hold (as trustee) or manage (as agent) their native title following a determination that native title exists. A nominated PBC is entered onto the National Native Title Register and at this point the corporation becomes known as a Registered Native Title Body Corporate (RNTBC). RNTBCs and PBCs are often commonly both referred to as PBCs.

As at 21 December 2015, there were 70 RNTBCs in Queensland and there were a further 5 successful determinations of native title for which the PBC was yet to be advised. Table 8 below provides links to information about these RNTBCs on the [Native Title Corporations \(NTC\)](#) website, the [Agreements, Treaties and Negotiated Settlements \(ATNS\)](#) website (where available) and native title determination information on the [National Native Title Tribunal \(NNTT\)](#) website.

Compliance regime for RNTBCs

The [NTA](#) and the [Native Title \(Prescribed Bodies Corporate\) Regulations 1999 \(Cth\)](#) (PBC Regulations) require corporations to register under the [Corporations \(Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander\) Act 2006 \(Cth\)](#) (CATSI Act) if they are determined by the Federal Court to hold and manage native title rights and interests. The [Office of the Registrar of Indigenous Corporations](#) (ORIC) supports and regulates corporations incorporated under the CATSI Act. ORIC provides advice on how to incorporate, training for corporation members and office holders and corporate governance. For information about RNTBCs use the corporations search tool on the [ORIC](#) website.

Native title corporations website

The NTRU manages the [Native Title Corporations](#) website, a resource for RNTBCs and for those engaging with them. It provides information about legislation and policies, events, resources and publications, training and running a RNTBC. Information about individual RNTBCs is provided in detailed [PBC profiles](#) (including links to PBC websites where available). 9. Future acts

Overview

A [future act](#) is a proposed activity on land or waters that may affect native title rights and interests. [Section 227](#) of the NTA sets out that: an act affects native title if it extinguishes the native title rights and interests or if it is otherwise wholly or partly inconsistent with their continued existence, enjoyment or exercise. Examples of future acts include the grant of a mining tenement, building public infrastructure, services or facilities and the compulsory acquisition of land. A future act is invalid to the extent it affects native title unless it complies with certain provisions in the NTA (see Subdivisions D-M of Division 3 of the [NTA](#)). These provisions include that a future act will be valid if parties to an Indigenous Land Use Agreement (ILUA) consent to it being done and details of the agreement are on the NNTT's [Register of ILUAs](#).

The future act process provides registered native title applicants and native title holders with specified rights, known as [procedural rights](#) from the time a claim is registered. The type of procedural rights which the native title group can exercise will vary (from the right to comment, be consulted, object or negotiate) depending on the type of future act that is being proposed. Generally the [right to negotiate](#) applies to future acts such as mining, exploration, prospecting, gas and petroleum exploration or extraction.

The [NNTT](#) administers the future act processes that attract the right to negotiate and provides information and support on future act related questions. The NNTT's role includes mediating between parties, conducting inquiries and making future act determinations when parties cannot reach agreement. Where a proposed future act meets the criteria set out in [s 237](#) of the NTA, it may attract an [expedited procedure](#). This means that the act may be validly done without negotiations if there are no objections to the act. For more information see the [future acts section](#) of the NNTT website. Information about the Queensland Government's future act processes for mining and resources are detailed on the Queensland Government's [Business & Industry portal](#), see [Native title for mining and resources](#).

Future act applications

As at 31 December 2015 there had been a total of 1,989 future act applications in QLD, see Table 9 below. Use the NNTT [Future act applications and determinations](#) search tool to find information about particular applications.

Future act agreements

A future act agreement is an agreement made under [s 31](#) of the NTA with native title parties about an activity that may affect native title. The Queensland Government has developed a template for section 31 agreements: see the [Section 31 agreements](#) section of the Queensland Government's [Business & Industry portal](#) for

more information. Once an agreement has been made the parties are required to lodge a copy of the agreement with the NNTT, however in most cases the parties provide only basic agreement information (to satisfy the NTA requirements). In some cases parties may make agreement information public and information about (some of) these public future act agreements are available on the ATNS website, see [Future act agreements \(Native Title Act\)](#).

10. Indigenous land use agreements

Overview

As at 31 December 2015, there were 668 registered Indigenous Land Use Agreements (ILUAs) in Queensland, 515 of these are Area Agreements (AA) and 153 are Body Corporate Agreements (BCA). Due to the large number of ILUAs in QLD the summary table of ILUAs has been moved to Appendix 1. This table provides links to ILUA information on the [Agreements, Treaties and Negotiated Settlements \(ATNS\)](#) website and ILUA information (providing access NNTT register extracts and maps) on the [National Native Title Tribunal \(NNTT\)](#) website (as at 31 December 2015).

Queensland Government ILUA and Pastoral template ILUA

The Queensland Government has implemented a [State Indigenous Land Use Agreement](#) that was negotiated between the Queensland Government, mining representative bodies, land councils and traditional land owners. It contains previously negotiated conditions that address native title requirements. These ILUAs generally relate to small scale mining ventures, such as opal and gemstone mining and are only for applications made under the [Mineral Resources Act 1989 \(Qld\)](#), and do not relate to coal. See the [ILUAs](#) section of the Queensland Government's [Business and Industry portal](#) for more information.

The Government has also developed a Pastoral ILUA template to facilitate the exercise of native title rights and interests over pastoral leases. See the [Native title information for landowners](#) section of the [Queensland Government](#) website for more information.

11. Cultural heritage

Overview

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples' cultural heritage in Queensland is primarily protected under the [Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act 2003 \(Qld\)](#) and the [Torres Strait Islander Cultural Heritage Act 2003 \(Qld\)](#). One of the key features of these Acts is the [duty of care](#) provisions which puts the onus on land users to take reasonable steps to ensure their activity does not harm Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander cultural heritage. This duty of care applies to all Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander cultural heritage regardless of whether or not it has been identified or recorded. As at 31 January 2015 these Acts are administered by the Cultural Heritage Unit of the Queensland Government's [Department of Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Partnerships](#).

A review of the Acts was completed by the (former Labor) Queensland Government and legislation to amend these (and other) Acts was introduced to the Queensland Parliament in November 2011, however it lapsed on 19 February 2012 before a change of Government in March 2012. See the [Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Land Holding Bill 2011 Explanatory Note \(PDF, 355KB\)](#) on the [Queensland Government: Office of the Queensland Parliamentary Counsel](#) website for more information. The subsequent legislation ([Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Land Holding Act 2013 \(QLD\)](#)) did not include amendments relating to the cultural heritage Acts.

The 2015 Queensland state election resulted in another change of government, however at the time of writing no further information was available about amendments to these Acts. Legislation

Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act 2003 (Qld) and the Torres Strait Islander Cultural Heritage Act 2003 (Qld)

The main purpose of the [Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act 2003 \(Qld\)](#) and the [Torres Strait Islander Cultural Heritage Act 2003 \(Qld\)](#) is to provide effective recognition, protection and conservation of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander cultural heritage. Cultural heritage includes areas or objects of significance. The Acts provide for the establishment of [cultural heritage databases & registers](#), however as mentioned above, protection under the Acts extends to all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander objects and areas regardless whether the cultural heritage has been recorded.

These Acts also establish a process for the registration of corporations as cultural heritage bodies who act as the first point of contact for cultural heritage issues. See [Cultural heritage bodies](#) on the Queensland Government's [Department of Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Partnerships](#) for information about these bodies.

The Acts also establish procedures for the preparation and implementation of [Cultural Heritage Management Plans](#) (CHMPs) detailing how any cultural heritage in a specified area will be managed when an environmental impact statement is required for the proposed project. CHMPs are developed through consultation with the relevant cultural heritage party for the area.

12. Land rights

Overview

The preambles to both the [Aboriginal Land Act 1991 \(Qld\)](#) (ALA) and the [Torres Strait Islander Land Act 1991 \(Qld\)](#) (TSILA) recognise the spiritual, social, cultural and economic importance of land to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and the need to enact special measures for the purpose of advancing the interests and responsibilities of the Aboriginal people and Torres Strait Islanders of Queensland and to rectify past injustices. These Acts are administered by the [Department of Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Partnerships](#) (DATSIP).

Together with the [Department of National Parks, Sports and Racing](#) (DNPSR), DATSIP is also involved in the Queensland Government's [Cape York Peninsula Tenure Resolution Program](#) which seeks to return ownership and management of identified lands on Cape York Peninsula to Aboriginal traditional owners. This process was enabled through the [Cape York Peninsula Heritage Act 2007 \(Qld\)](#). For more information see [Cape York Land Council](#) website; the Cape York Peninsula tenure resolution program section of the DATSIP website and the [Joint management of Cape York National Parks](#) section on the DNPSR website.

Legislation

[Aboriginal Land Act 1991 \(Qld\) and Torres Strait Islander Land Act 1991 \(Qld\)](#)

The [Aboriginal Land Act 1991 \(Qld\)](#) (ALA) and the [Torres Strait Islander Land Act 1991 \(QLD\)](#) (TSILA) enabled the transfer of all existing deed of grant in trust (DOGIT), reserve lands, and the Arukun and Mornington Island shire leases to trustees for the benefit of either Aboriginal people or Torres Strait Islanders. The ALA established the Aboriginal Land Tribunal to hear claims for vacant Crown land (which is gazetted as claimable land), but the legislation did not establish a land acquisition fund as was done in NSW. No new claims have been received by the Tribunal since 22 December 2006 as [s 60](#) of the Act provides that claims needed to be made within fifteen years of commencement of the Act. As at 30 June 2014 there was one outstanding proceeding relating to Boodjamulla (Lawn Hill) National Park. Information about the status of land claims is available in the annual report of the Aboriginal Land Tribunal.

These Acts were amended in 2011 through the [Aboriginal Land and Torres Strait Islander Land and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2011 \(Qld\)](#). The amendments sought to improve the interaction between the land holding acts and the [Native Title Act 1993 \(Cth\)](#) including enabling land to be granted under the Acts to bodies registered under the [Corporations \(Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander\) Act 2006 \(Cth\)](#) (CATSI Act). See the [Land transfers](#) section of the Queensland Government website for more information.

[Aborigines and Torres Strait Islanders \(Land Holding\) Act 2013 \(Qld\)](#)

Under the then *Aborigines and Torres Strait Islanders (Land Holding) Act 1985* (ATSILHA) residents of Indigenous deed of grant in trust and reserve communities could apply for the grant of perpetual leases for residential purposes or special leases for commercial purposes. The introduction of the ALA and TSILA created issues for existing lease applications and also meant that no new applications could be made. In order to address these issues the QLD Government began a review of the ATSILHA in 2010 and subsequently introduced the [Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Land Holding Act 2013 \(Qld\)](#). This legislation enables outstanding lease issues to be addressed and establishes stakeholder reference panels to consider

lease entitlements and boundary issues. See the [Land Holding Act leases](#) section on the Queensland Government website for more information.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Land (Providing Freehold) Act 2014 (Qld)

In 2014 the Queensland Government introduced the [Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Land \(Providing Freehold\) Act 2014](#) which includes provisions to enable ordinary freehold title (in the township areas) of the state's 34 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities located in either an Aboriginal shire council or an Indigenous regional council where the land tenure is DOGIT. Under this Act, which commenced on 1 January 2015, native title must be either surrendered or previously extinguished before freehold will be granted. See the [Freehold title in Indigenous communities](#) section on the Department of Natural Resources and Mines website and the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Social Justice Commissioner's [Social Justice and Native Title Report 2014](#) for more information.

Related legislation

North Stradbroke Island Protection and Sustainability Act 2011 (Qld)

The [North Stradbroke Island Protection and Sustainability Act 2011 \(Qld\)](#) facilitates, under other Acts, the staged creation of areas to be jointly managed by the State and Aboriginal traditional owners of the region.

Indigenous owned or controlled land in Queensland

Information about Indigenous owned or controlled land is compiled by the Productivity Commission as part of its [Overcoming Indigenous Disadvantage](#) reports. The most recent report, [Overcoming Indigenous Disadvantage: Key Indicators 2014](#), was released on 19 November 2014. Chapter 9 (section 9.2 and Table 9A.2.1) of this report provides information about Indigenous owned or controlled land (which includes land that is freehold, leasehold, crown, license, Aboriginal Deed of Grant in Trust or not stated tenure). Table 9 below provides a summary of Indigenous owned or controlled land in Queensland.

Cape York Tenure Resolution Program

The program was enabled by the [Aboriginal Land Amendment Regulation \(No 5\) 2014 \(Qld\)](#). The [Cape York Peninsula Tenure Resolution Program](#) returns ownership and management of particular lands on Cape York Peninsula to local Aboriginal people while also ensuring the conservation values of that land are retained. The State government has transferred more than 1,700,000 hectares of land to Aboriginal freehold. Areas with outstanding environmental values are dedicated as jointly managed national parks, and existing national parks are converted to jointly managed national parks.

13. ILC land purchases

Overview

The [Indigenous Land Corporation](#) (ILC) was established in 1995. It is a [Corporate Commonwealth Entity](#) under the [Public Governance, Performance and Accountability Act 2013 \(Cth\)](#) and a portfolio agency of the [Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet](#). Since 2005 the ILC has been administered under the [Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Act 2005 \(Cth\)](#) (see part 4A of the Act).

The ILC is accountable to Parliament through the [Minister for Indigenous Affairs](#), and it is this Minister who appoints the [ILC Board](#). The ILC Board is responsible for all policy and land purchase decisions and is not under the direction of the Minister. The ILC's purpose is to assist Indigenous people to acquire and manage land to achieve economic, environmental, social and cultural benefits. The ILC acquires and grants

properties to Indigenous organisations and assists Indigenous landholders to sustainably manage land and develop viable and sustainable land uses including: developing property management plans, purchasing equipment, or developing infrastructure. The ILC has recently made changes to its program delivery structure, combining its land acquisition and management functions into a single program: [Our Land Our Future](#). See the [Corporate documents](#) section of the ILC website for copies of the ILC's national, state and territory land strategies.

ILC land purchases

As at 30 June 2015, the ILC had purchased 56 properties in Queensland covering a total area of 1,477,383.50 hectares. The titles to 34 of these properties had been transferred to Aboriginal organisations. 14. Indigenous protected areas

Overview

An Indigenous Protected Area (IPA) is an area of Indigenous-owned land (or sea) where Indigenous landowners have entered into a voluntary agreement with the Australian Government for the purposes of promoting biodiversity and cultural resource conservation. The declaration of an IPA over Indigenous owned lands results in that land being part of the [National Reserve System](#). The IPA program is administered by the [Indigenous Affairs Group](#) within the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet.

15. Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander population

Overview

The [Australian Bureau of Statistics](#) (ABS) conducts a census of the Australian population every five years. The [Census of Population and Housing](#) collects information about the number and characteristics of people who are in Australia on census night and the dwellings in which they live. The most recent Census was conducted on 9 August 2011. To address this problem of undercounting the ABS adjusts the

Census count to derive the estimated resident Indigenous population (see ABS Catalogue no. 3238.0.55.001: [Estimates of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians, June 2011](#) on the ABS website). The estimated resident Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander population in QLD at 30 June 2011 was 188,954.
