The groups originally signed a joint land deal with Woodside, but wish to withdraw the original claim in order to lodge their own separate claims. | 22/03/2013 | NT  | Federal Parliament introduces Bill in<br>Jabiru matter        | Federal Indigenous Affairs Minister Jenny Macklin has commented in Federal Parliament on a Bill amending land right laws in the Northern Territory, to allow for the transfer of Jabiru in the Northern Territory, currently a national park, from the Crown to Aboriginal freehold vested in the Kakadu Aboriginal Land Trust, providing certainty and security of land tenure in the region. | 27/03/2013 | AUS | Senate Committee hand down report          | The Senate Legal Affairs Committee has expressed frustration over the timelines of the Attorney-General's provision of information crucial to an enquiry in to the <i>Native Title Amendment Bill 2012</i> , introduced by former Attorney-General Nicola Roxon. | 27/03/2013 | NT  | Koongarra incorporated in to Kakadu        | Traditional owner Jeffrey Lee's campaign to have Koongarra incorporated in to Kakadu National Park was realised when the Senate passed a Bill formally adding Koongarra to the park.
