


Aims of the Discovery Project

- Are Australian Indigenous communities taking on the task of comprehensive political governance?
- Are the principles of North American
 Indigenous nation building useful in Australia?
- How does the difference between corporate/organisational governance and political governance manifest itself in Australia?
- What tools and processes might support

Methods

- Desktop search for candidate cases
 - Where is 'nation selfdetermination' being practised?
 - What nations might have appropriate (culturally legitimate & effective) institutions for comparison?
 - What nations appear to be operating according to a strategic plan?
- Fieldwork to understand nations' governing operations and self-conceptions
