

Outcomes

The land tenure reform pilots measure is generating the following outcomes:

- Showing what can be achieved under existing land administration arrangements.
- Developing an evidence base and guidance that can be used by other groups to achieve their aspirations.
- Demonstrating the value of engagement between government, industry and Indigenous land holders.

- Proposals should focus on Indigenous land holders and deliver practical improvements to their communities.
